The type of research described is normative research using legal materials conducted with document study techniques as well as descriptions of respondents. The number of respondents in this study was 135 people using disproportional random sampling technique. Data is collected by means of an observation and questionnaire. The results of study showed that the regulation of legal protection against work fatigue was regulated in the 1945 Constitution, Law no. 1 of 1970 concerning K3, Law No. 13 of 2003 concerning Employment, Law No. 40 of 2004 concerning the National Social Security System, Law No. 36 of 2009 concerning Health, Law No. 24 of 2011 concerning BPJS, PP No. 50 of 2012 concerning OHS Management Implementation Respondents aged > 4 years experience mild complaints of 12 people and moderate complaints of 50 people. Respondents aged 40 years and over experience mild fatigue of 16 people, moderate complaints of 57 people. Respondents with below normal nutritional status experienced mild fatigue of 1 person, moderate fatigue of 98 people. Respondents with normal nutritional status experienced 22 people with mild fatigue, 98 with moderate fatigue. Response with obesity status experienced mild fatigue as many as 5 people, moderate fatigue as many as 6 people Respondents with moderate risk work attitude experienced mild fatigue as many as 11 people, high risk work attitude as many as 17 people experienced moderate fatigue as many as 77 people. Male respondents experienced mild fatigue of 23 people and moderate fatigue of 79 people, female respondents experienced mild fatigue of 5 people and moderate fatigue of as many as 28 people. The study concluded that respondents aged 40 years and under experience more moderate fatigue than those who experienced mild fatigue, those aged over 40 years experienced more moderate fatigue, and compared to experiencing mild fatigue. Respondents who were under normal nutritional status experienced more moderate fatigue

than those who experienced mild fatigue. While respondents with normal nutritional status experienced more fatigue than mild fatigue. From the conclusions it is suggested that respondents know the nutritional intake, avoiding muscle tension by always stretching the muscles and the company setting up ergonomic facilities.

Science, Public Health and Nation-Building in Soekarno-Era Indonesia Sep 09 2020 In 1949, the newly-independent Indonesia inherited a health system that was devastated by three-and-a-half years of Japanese occupation and four years of revolutionary struggle against the Dutch. Additionally, the country had to cope with the resurgence of epidemic and endemic diseases. The Ministry of Health had initiated a number of symbolic public health initiatives – both during the Indonesian Revolution (1945 to 1949) and the early 1950s – resulting in a noticeable decline of mortality. These initiatives fuelled the newly-independent nation's confidence because they demonstrated to the international community that Indonesia was capable of standing on its own feet. Unfortunately, by the mid-1950s, Indonesia's public health program faltered due to a constellation of factors attributed to the political tensions between Java and the Outer Islands, administrative problems, corruption, and rampant inflation. The optimism that characterised the early years of independence gave way to despair. The Soekarno era could, therefore, be interpreted as the era of bold plans but unfulfilled aspirations in Indonesian public health. Based on extensive archival research and a close reading of Indonesian primary sources, this book provides a nuanced account of the inner tensions in Indonesian public health during the twentieth century – between a narrow biomedical approach that emphasised disease eradication, and a holistic approach that linked public health to practical concerns of nation-building.

Changes of Regime And Social Dynamics in West Java Jan 02 2020 This volume deals with the sultanate of Banten from the outbreak of the rebellion of 1750-52 to the launching of the Cultivation System in 1830. After the suppression of the rebellion by the Dutch East India Company (VOC), local society showed considerable vitality. The introduction by the VOC of forced exploitation of the pepper cultivation did not lead to a significant increase in production, but enabled the local elites to augment their power. In the late 18th century Asian traders (many Bugis and Chinese) and English country traders integrated Banten and its Sumatran territory Lampung into a vibrant inter-regional trading network. This trade pattern, which involved the exchange of pepper and the maritime and forest products demanded by the China market for opium, contributed to the emergence of a new economic order in insular South-East Asia. This study shows how the the society of Banten was in a state of constant transformation in reaction to the Western presence and the shifts of the world economy during the period from 1750 to 1830.

The Heritage of Arung Palakka Jan 26 2022 to use the Dutch presence to institute far-reaching innovations in his society. It became apparent that, while the Company's initial involvement with South Sulawesi had required some military action, its subsequent activities were often limited to that of arbiter in local disputes. Yet its approval was an essential element without which no local prince could exercise authority confidently. The reputation of the Company helped to sustain its position and that of anyone fortunate or clever enough to become linked with it. Arung Palakka's repeated references throughout his life to this link served a dual purpose: it reaffirmed his continuing devotion and loyalty to the Company, while reminding the people of South Sulawesi of the weapon which he could wield if necessary to maintain power. Bearing the Company's trust as a right, Arung Palakka was able to introduce changes with little real opposition from within South Sulawesi. The Company has often been blamed for radical innovations in Malay-Indonesian societies, but as this study shows, in South Sulawesi at least the initiative clearly came from a local ruler. Only research in other areas influenced by the Company's presence will demonstrate whether or not the South Sulawesi experience was unique. A secondary but nonetheless important reason for this study was to examine the roots of the large scale emigrations from South Sulawesi in the second half of the 17th century.

Political Change and Territoriality in Indonesia Oct 11 2020 What makes large, multi-ethnic states hang together? At a time when ethnic and religious conflict has gained global prominence, the territorial organization of states is a critical area of study. Exploring how multi-ethnic and geographically dispersed states grapple with questions of territorial administration and change, this book argues that territorial change is a result of ongoing negotiations between states and societies where mutual and overlapping interests can often emerge. It focuses on the changing dynamics of central-local relations in Indonesia.
